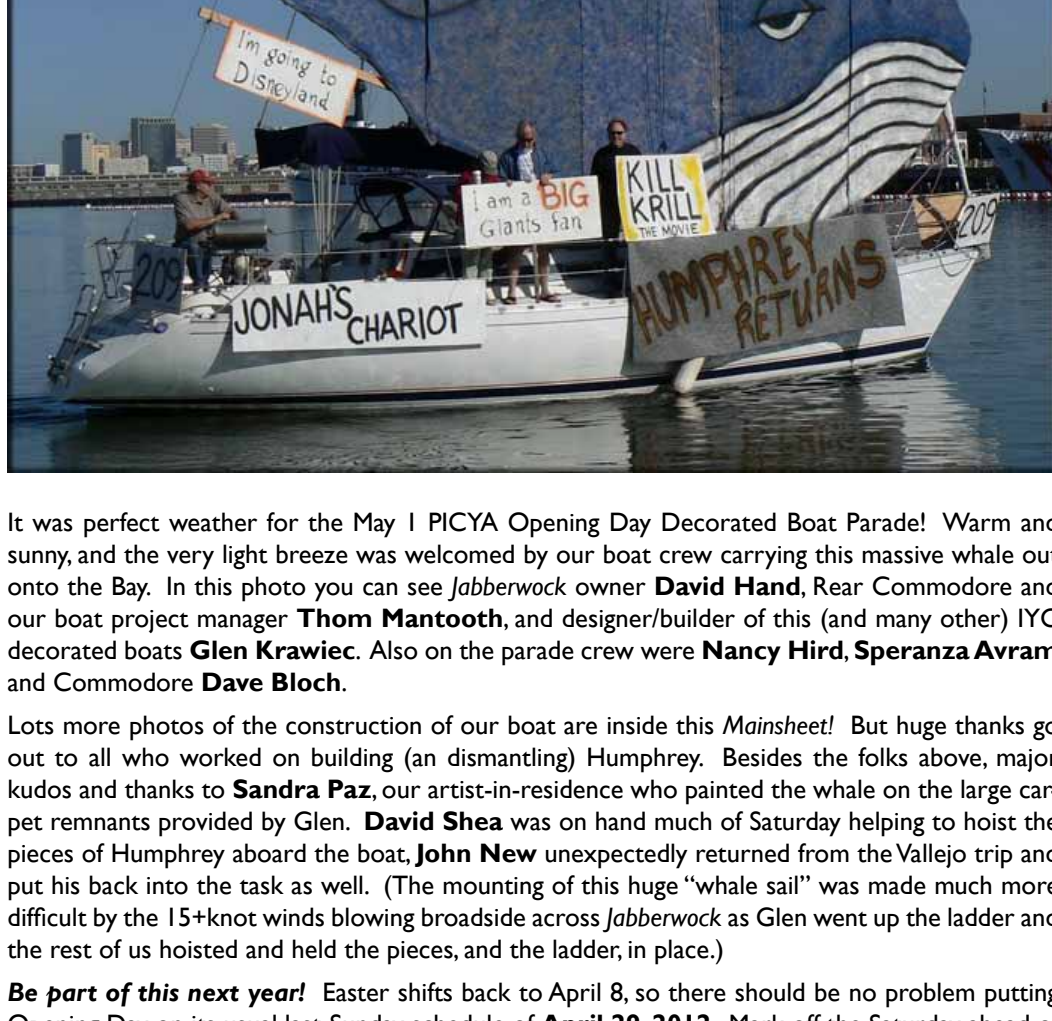

Also on the parade crew were **Nancy Hird**, **Speranza Avram** and Commodore **Dave Bloch**.

Lots more photos of the construction of our boat are inside this Mainsheet! But huge thanks go out to all who worked on building (an dismantling) Humphrey. Besides the folks above, major kudos and thanks to **Sandra Paz**, our artist-in-residence who painted the whale on the large carpet remnants provided by **Glen**. **David Shea** was on hand much of Saturday helping to hold the pieces of Humphrey aboard the boat. **John New** unexpectedly returned from the Vallejo trip and put his back into the task as well. (The mounting of this huge "whale sail" was made much more difficult by the 15+knot winds blowing broadcast across Jabberwock as Glen went up the ladder and the rest of us hoisted and held the pieces, and the ladder, in place.)

Be part of this next year! Easter ships back to April 8, so there should be no problem putting Opening Day on its usual last-Sunday schedule of **April 29, 2012**. Mark off the Saturday ahead of that so you can help out on building the boat! It's really a lot of fun.

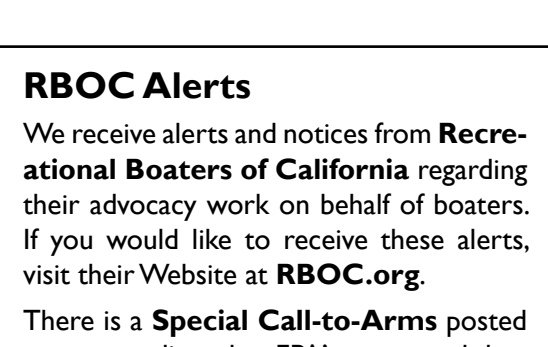

Racing Report

HI RACE FANS!
 The second 2011 Spring *Island Nights* is in the books. The wind was better than the first race with all starters finishing within the time limit. We rigged *Wuvulu* with the 120 jib expecting 10-plus knots, but that was a bit optimistic.

We had 12 boats in the A fleet with the *Wiley Wabbit* *Wadio Active*, correcting out to 4 seconds behind *Twisted the Farr 40*, and all finishers within 11 minutes. The 168 fleet with 4 boats, including Staff Commodore **David Ross's** *Merit 24 Faster*, *Phantom* took first. The nine boats in the Charlie fleet followed *My Taine Too* and *Lela Two* around the course. *Lela Two*, with a fresh bottom, even without flying a kite was too fast for *Wuvulu*! The two Ivans returned with *Majo* in the non-spinner fleet.

Thanks to Rear Commodore **Thom Mantooth** and **Glen Krawiec** for running the race deck and putting out the marks, **Speranza Avram** for tending bar and Commodore **Dave Bloch** and **Wuvulu's** **Debbie Ratto** for getting the Galley going. (We also had a father/daughter team on the race deck helping the start; they're buying a boat on that dock; the Race Committee invited them down to the end and put them to work!) IYC had 3 boats in **The Great Vallejo YRA Race** on Saturday and Sunday. The light wind/strong ebb combination was too much for *Wuvulu* but **George Lythcott's** *Taz!*, Vice Commodore **Kristen Soetebier** on *Tiger Beetle*, and Staff Commodore **David Ross** in the *Olsen 30* lived made it to the party.

Summer Sailsite Coming Up June 18 at Encinal Yacht Club

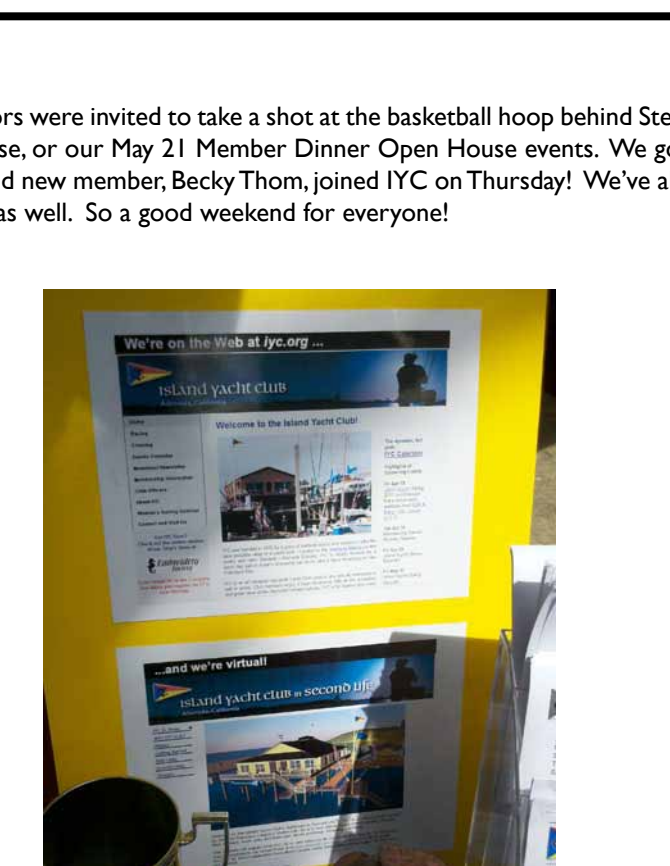
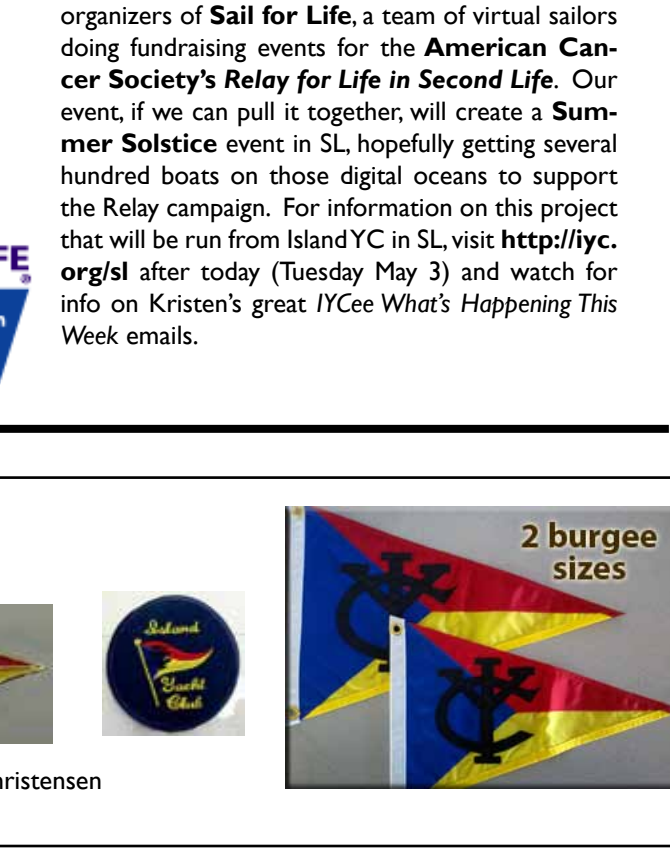

Started in the Bay Area by *Latitude 38* associate publisher **John Arndt**, Summer Sailsite marks its 11th year with a family-friendly celebration of sailing hosted at **Encinal Yacht Club** in Alameda. The Bay Area is invited to attend this free full-day event. Activities include educational seminars, sailing demonstrations, a boat building competition, sailboat rides for families, entertainment, plus several food and beverage vendors.

Support From a Global Community
 In 2010, Summer Sailsite revelers in 50 U.S. states and 47 countries participated in everything from ocean racing regattas, social sails on a lake and family picnics aboard a rowboat, to philanthropic events with organizations such as Bay Area Association of Disabled Sailors (BAADS) and Heart of Sailing that takes disadvantaged children out on the water. Each year underwriting and sponsorship for this, and the many Summer Sailsite events held around the world, comes from generous donations offered by vendors such as Footloose Sailing Vacations, Hunter Marine, West Marine, Hobie, Offshore Sailing, Harken, Woodenboat and more. 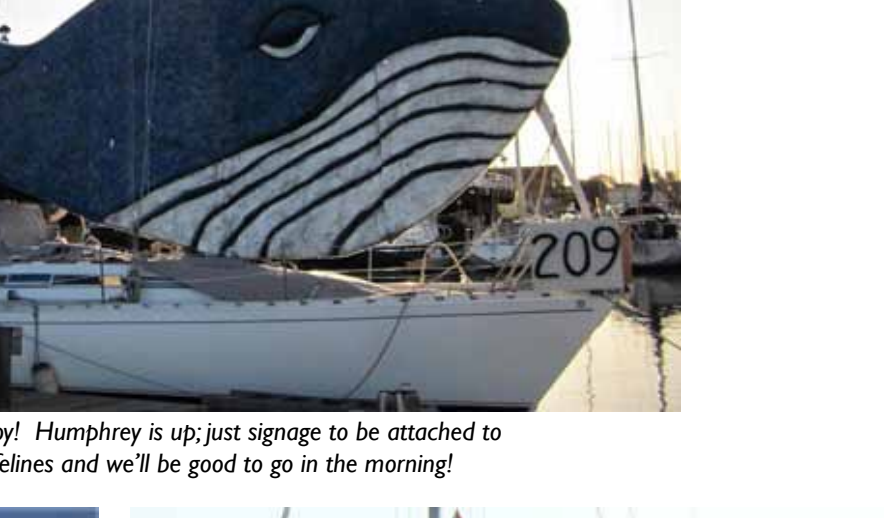

Saturday morning:

The pieces were brought down to the deck, staples and bracing added, and the Giants cap bolted to the top.



Humphrey's head was hoisted into place with one of the halyards, and screwed on tied to a long 2x4 (and to anything else we could find). The wind is starting to come up, blowing more than 15 knots across the beam.

Sunday morning now, and Humphrey Returns does a photo lap out in the Estuary before heading to the staging area.



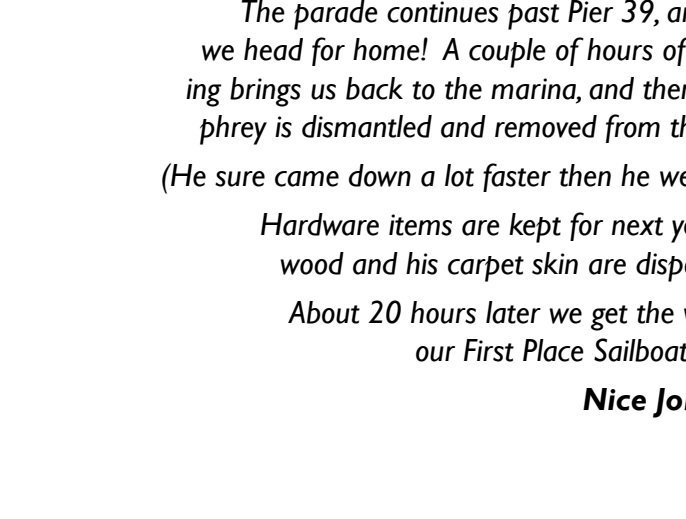
